REQUIREMENTS TO COMPLETE THE ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE

- Completion of 90 college level credits with a minimum cumulative 2.0 g.p.a.
- At least 15 credits numbered 100 or higher must be earned at the North Seattle Community College.
- Students transferring to a baccalaureate institution should be aware that the A.A. degree does not guarantee admission nor does it meet all admission/distribution requirements for all majors at all universities.
- Most baccalaureate institutions require completion of the A.A. degree prior to admission in order to receive the benefits of the Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA). Students need to complete an application to graduate.
- Course numbers may change and new courses may be added or deleted which will affect the accuracy of this list.
- Many four-year institutions require students to complete foreign language for admission and/or graduation. Please check with the four-year institution you plan on transferring to regarding foreign language requirements.
